# THE MAPLETON ACADIAN FOREST TRAIL

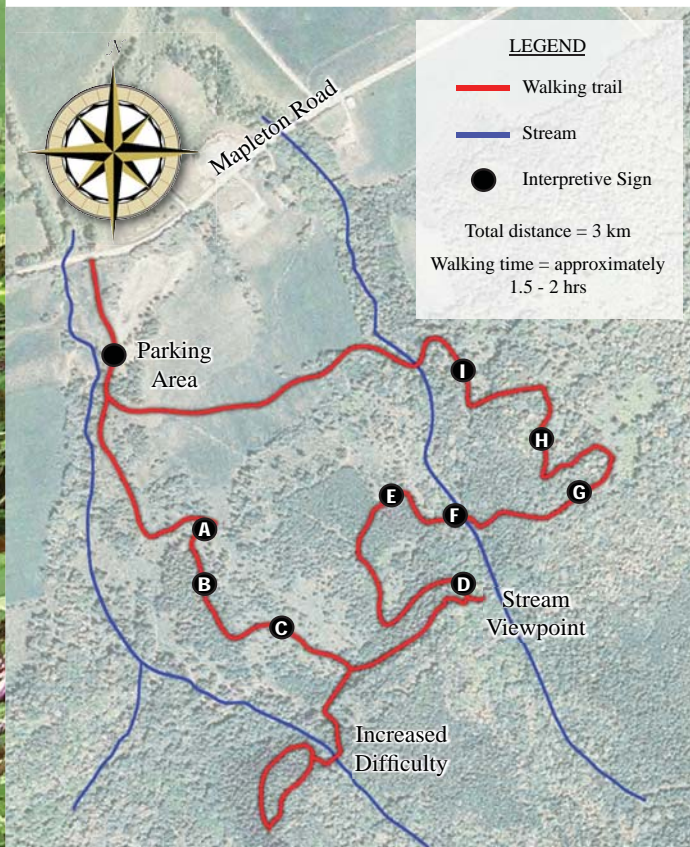


The Mapleton Acadian Forest Trail is an interpretive nature trail near beautiful Elgin, New Brunswick, constructed and maintained by the Elgin Eco Association. The trail provides an opportunity to learn about the Acadian Forest and how it responds to a variety of human disturbances. The trail features nine interpretive signs and two footbridges. It crosses a wide variety of forest types and conditions.

Be sure to view these informative interpretive signs strategically placed along the trail:

- (A) Recent Clear-cut
- (B) Dark Spruce Forest
- (C) Old Field
- (D) Old Forest beside the Field
- (E) White Birch & Jack Pine Stands
- (F) Shady Stream
- (G) Ecologically Sensitive Forest Community
- (H) Northern Flying Squirrels
- (I) Mining Manganese



## HOW TO FIND THE TRAIL

From Highway #1, take exit # 233 at Petitcodiac onto route 905 toward Elgin. Drive approximately 15 min (20km) to the turnoff for the Mapleton Road (just before arriving at the Elgin Corner). Turn left on the Mapleton Road (route 895). Follow this road 4.5 km and there will be a sign on the right for the Mapleton Acadian Forest Trail.
